ARGH is a collective advocacy, campaigning and lobbying group of Autistic adults. ARGH was founded by a group of Autistic people who were passionate about autistic rights and the lack of representation there was from our community in the conversation about autism.

We continue to fight to be included on equal terms; our aim is for Autistic people to be at the core of all things about us, from personal life to policy at government level. We are involved locally and nationally (including the Scottish Government Reference Group) in order to get the Autistic voice heard and promote the inclusion of Autistic people at all levels of society.

ARGH promote self advocacy for all Autistic people, recognising that this is not limited to a certain type of Autistic person: everyone self advocates but many are ignored.



We are the leading UK charity for people with autism (including Asperger syndrome) and their families. With the help of our members, supporters and volunteers we provide information, support and pioneering services, and campaign for a better world for people with autism.

Around 700,000 people in the UK have autism with over 50,000 of those living in Scotland. The National Autistic Society is there at every stage, to help transform the lives of everyone living with autism.

We want a world where all people living with autism get to lead the life they choose; everyone living with autism will:

1. Get the support, education and training they need
2. Live with dignity and as independently as possible
3. Be part of their community and wider society
4. Be understood by all professionals who support them
